Department Summary The Public Works, Facilities & Parks Department (PWFP) serves to plan for the future needs of the County, manage infrastructure and County facilities, and protect natural resources. PWFP is comprised of three Divisions: Public Works, Facilities, and Parks which are responsible for managing and maintaining the County's infrastructure and open space including Fleet Administration, Records Retention, Mail and Courier services.

Position Summary The Public Works, Facilities & Parks Department has a vacant Supervising Mechanic position. The Supervising Mechanic class is assigned to supervise and review the work of mechanics and other subordinate personnel in the central garage engaged in the maintenance and repair of Monterey County vehicles and equipment. The incumbent/s will evaluate, plan, schedule and coordinate the activities of the central garage.

Examples of Experience/Education/Training: Any combination of training, education and/or experience which provides the knowledge, skills and abilities and required conditions of employment is qualifying. An example of a way these requirements might be acquired is: Education: Completion of the equivalent of three years of classroom training and supervised on the job training in the automotive and heavy equipment field. Experience: Five years as a Mechanic III in Monterey County performing lead level mechanical work on automotive and/or heavy-duty construction equipment and five years supervisory experience.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT The required conditions of employment include, but are not limited to the following: Possess a valid California Class C driver license at the time of appointment and possess and maintain a satisfactory driving record or provide evidence of suitable transportation which is approved by the appointing authority. This position is subject to drug and alcohol testing as required by the Omnibus Transportation Employee Testing Act of 1991. Possess or acquire both a valid California Class A Driver's License and required endorsements necessary to operate fleet equipment, during the probationary period. Pass a pre-employment physical examination.
