Have you ever thought about a career in Public Works Construction Inspection? Do you love working outdoors? Are you looking for a career where every day is different but the organization is stable? Does the idea of inspecting roads, storm drains and sewers while working with the public, contractors, and, developers interest you? Do you work well with others and love the challenge of tough assignments? Then we want to talk to you!

The Public Works Inspector will conduct field inspections of public works projects including construction of streets, bridges, water systems, sewers, subdivision and commercial street improvements, landscape maintenance, encroachment activities and grading; ensures conformance with City standard specifications and safety standards; and maintains records and prepares reports on projects inspected. This is a broad classification with individual positions assigned to specific functional areas; duties and assignments may overlap depending on the operational needs of the department and staffing levels.

The Ideal Candidate will possess: Some experience in plan reading, daily report writing, and assuring compliance with plans and specifications. Knowledge of the "Green Book", erosion control, and standard traffic control practices. The ability to learn and inspect the field installation of standard plates, manufacturers details, and change orders supplied by engineers. The ability to understand and carry out oral and written instructions. Sufficient physical ability to perform moderate to heavy lifting and walking on uneven surfaces. The ability to work in inclement weather and perform occasional inspections on evenings, weekends, and holidays. Defining characteristics such as dependability, hardworking, and a positive attitude.

Any combination of education and experience that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge and abilities would be: Education/Training: Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade supplemented by specialized and technical training in the building and construction trades. Experience: Two years of responsible experience involving the construction and maintenance of public works or water facilities, depending on area of assignment. License or Certificate: Possession of, or ability to obtain, an appropriate, valid driver's license. If assigned to the Waterworks Division, certification as a Water Distribution Operator Grade D2 issued by the State of California Water Resources Control Board is required. Possession of, and ability to maintain, certification as a Water Distribution Operator Grade D3 is required within 18 months of employment.
